

# JUNIOR HIGH

We at St. James are very proud of the fine program being offered to our seventh and eighth graders, and would like to share it with you.

The adolescent years of 12 to 14 marks the period of the greatest physical, emotional and social changes your child and you, as his or her parents, will experience. Change sometimes comes so quickly and affects a child so profoundly that neither the Child nor his family can keep up with it. The school, in cooperation with the family, helps the child to make his or her way through this exciting and sometimes frightening period. Our goal is to ensure that the children who graduate from St. James will carry the sure conviction that God walks with them in every phase of their lives and is there even in their darkest moments. ## FAITH FORMATION MESSAGE

The integration of God and academics is what St. James does best. Religion is not just another subject—'religion' means "relationship to God." All relationships need time in order to grow. Time to grow in the knowledge of God's love is the gift of a Catholic grammar school education. Technically, 150 minutes are allotted each full week of school to faith formation through prayer and education. During this time, on the Junior High level, the focus is on our Catholic faith and on the richness of our traditions.

St. James provides a comfortable and non-threatening atmosphere for the Junior High student. In essence, the value of a Catholic Junior High education is tremendous. The lessons learned here transcend the intellectual plane. The lessons learned here enrich the life of the soul.

## CURRICULUM

St. James offers an excellent curriculum designed to challenge each student and prepare him or her for high school level work. The faculty and staff strive to develop competence in critical thinking skills, effective study habits, reading comprehension, mathematics and writing skills.

A key component of our junior high curriculum is the

**SOCIAL OUTREACH ACTIVITIES** Many seventh and eighth graders regularly donate many hours of service to the community. This trip is the highlight and culmination of the junior high experience.
